

Math 154, Exam 2 Information, Spring 2003 (This information is also on the web.)

Exam 2 is on Monday, March 10 from 8:30 PM – 9:30 PM in the Hall of Music.

You are sitting in the same general location as Exam 1.

No graphing and/or programmable calculators.

Do not ask any questions during the exam unless you think there is a typo. It is not fair for an instructor to give you a hint unless the same hint is given to all the students in the Hall.

The exam consists of 14 multiple-choice questions; covering lessons 12 through 22 from section 6.7 through the first part of section 7.6. You will hand in your answer sheet and leave the exam site with your exam. Your answer sheet will be the only thing graded. Answer every question, since there are no points deducted for a wrong answer. Each question is worth the same amount of points. There is no partial credit.

Only the formulas from the formula sheet will be provided on the cover page. All others need to be memorized. The formula sheet is available at the MA 154 web page.

Previous exams are available at the course web site. Not every problem on the exam will be just like a problem from an old exam. Homework, quizzes and the review problems should be studied to be adequately prepared. The number of lessons covered on each exam varies from semester to semester. Old exams are a guide, however, be careful. All problems on the ASSIGNMENT SHEET are fair game for the exam. Do not assume that if it was not on SAGE it is not on the exam.
