- Know the calculator policy. Students can use only a one-line scientific calculator on the exams. In fact, a scientific calculator is required for some problems. No multi-line, graphing, or programmable calculators are allowed, nor are programmable data devices are allowed. If a student does not bring their own appropriate calculator, they will take the exam without a calculator. Without exception, no sharing of calculators is permitted at the exam, as per the ground rules for MA 152.
- 1) Exam 3 covers portions of chapters 2, 3, and 4. This material is covered in lessons #20-31.
- 2) There are fifteen multiple-choice problems on the exam. The exam will be machine graded. No partial credit will be given.
- 3) Any formulas from chapter 4 that are needed will be provided on the exam.
- 4) The exam is self-explanatory. No questions will be allowed unless a student believes there is a typographical or printing error.

- 6) Exams from previous semesters are available on the web page These are good for review purposes, but not a guarantee of what will or will not be the exam.
- 7) Students must bring a PHOTO ID with them to the exam. It is recommended that students arrive early.
- 8) No one will be allowed to leave the exam site for the first 20 minutes of the exam. Students arriving after 20 minutes will be allowed to take the make-up exam. If they arrived late for a non-valid reason, a grade penalty will be applied
