- 1) Exam 1 covers chapter 1 and sections 2.1 through 2.4. This is the material covered in **lessons** #10-22.
- 2) There are fifteen multiple-choice problems on the exam. The exam will be machine graded. No partial credit will be given. You will be allowed 60 minutes to take the exam.
- 3) The exam is self-explanatory. No questions will be allowed unless a student believes there is a typographical or printing error.
- 4) The following are **appropriate review problems**. These problems are found in the textbook in the chapter summary review exercises section at the end of chapters 1 and 2. The answers are provided at the back of the book.
 - Chapter 1 (page 157): 7-11 all, 21, 19, 20, 22, 23, 24, 27, 31, 33, 34, 37-40 all, 42, 43, 45, 46, 49, 51, 53, 58, 60, 62, 67, 68, 69, 80-83 all
 - Chapter 2 (page 233):): 2, 6, 8, 9, 11, 12, 14-16 all, 21, 25, 29-32 all, 33, 36-39 all, 43-45 all, 47, 48, 50-52 all

There is also a chapter test at the end of each chapter. You may practice some of those problems as well. The answers are in the back of the book. It is recommended that you re-work **all** homework problems. You cannot re-do the online problems once the due date has passed, but you can view the problems and your responses. You can also work the corresponding problems from the textbook.

- 5) Students need to know the **formulas** for the perimeter and area of a rectangle or square, the area of a triangle, the distance formula d = rt, the simple interest formula, the sum of angles in a triangle, the mid-point formula, the slope formula, point-slope form, slope-intercept form, and general form. Any other needed formulas will be provided, including the quadratic formula and the distance between two points formula.
- 6) **Exams from previous semesters** are available on the web page.

 These are good for review purposes, but **not a guarantee** of what will or will not be on the exam. Do not use these past exams as your only means of studying. Review homework problems and quiz problems.
- 7) Students <u>must bring a **PHOTO ID**</u> with them to the exam, preferably your Purdue ID. It is recommended that students arrive if Teresa requests.

- 8) No one will be allowed to leave the exam site for the first 20 minutes after the exam begins. Students arriving after 20 minutes of the exam will be allowed to take the make-up exam. If they arrived late for a non-valid reason, a grade penalty will be applied.
- 9) Your instructor will describe where you will be seated and will assign seats. You are to sit in your assigned seat.
- Bring with you the following: pencils, erasers, and Purdue ID. **Do not bring a** calculator or scratch paper. Turn your cell phone off; or better, do not bring it. Do not wear hats or tinted glasses (sunglasses). Book bags, totes, or purses should be closed.
