

Module 20 What Is Memory?

Memory is most often defined as “an internal record or representation of some prior event or experience” (Purdy, Markham, Schwartz, & Gordon, 2001, p. 9). Without memory we have no past because learning is lost. Memory may be our most important and valuable mental process. Realize, however, that this internal record is fallible. It may be composed of less detail (or more) than the actual event or experience. Recognizing the problems and frailties of memory, I have sprinkled memory improvement suggestions throughout this section. Tip number one: *organization*. When you want to learn and remember a large amount of information, you must organize it into meaningful patterns or categories. To provide an example, I have summarized and organized the first section of this unit to create [Summary Table 20.1](#). Like a map that helps you plan your trip, this overview gives you “the big picture,” which will help you learn and *organize* upcoming material.
