

MA 22000 Final Exam Information, Spring 2012

The final exam is scheduled for Tuesday, May 1st, at 8:00 AM (8:00-10:00) in the Elliott Hall of Music. Seats are assigned and you should receive your assigned seat from your instructor by the end of 'dead' week. Only your instructor has the seating chart for your class. (There is a possibility seating charts will be posted on the course web page.)

The final exam is a 150 point, comprehensive, multiple-choice exam. There are 25 questions on the exam and you will have two hours to complete it. The only formulas provided are those listed on the formula sheet on the course web page. Note that we do not use 'none of the above' as an answer choice.

Please bring to the exam: **a photo ID (preferably your Purdue ID), pencils, erasers, and your 1-line scientific calculator.** Without your photo ID, you may not be allowed to take the final. Further, you will need to code your ten-digit Purdue ID number on the answer sheet, to be sure your instructor receives your score on the final.

Practice problems for the final are available on the course web page. However, do not focus solely on these problems to review. Be sure to also look at the homework problems, the quizzes, your instructor's examples from class, and your mid-term exams.

Remember to bring a one-line scientific calculator to the final. Students cannot share calculators at the final, and cell phone cannot be used as calculators. (In fact, cell phones must be turned off and put away during the final exam.)

There is no partial credit on the exam. However, you should circle your answer on the exam itself. In the unlikely event that anything happens to your answer sheet, the exam will be used as a backup. (However, note that no re-grades will be allowed for miscoded answer sheets.)

At the end of the final, you will turn in **both** your answer sheet and the exam itself. If all goes well, final exam scores and exam letter grade estimates will be available via the course web page by early Thursday afternoon. Course grades will not be available until later in the week and are only available from your classroom instructor (or through MyPurdue the following week).

If you need to request an alternate final, please contact your classroom instructor and the course coordinator (Charlotte Bailey, MATH 802) immediately. The only guaranteed reasons for an alternate final without penalty are three final in one day, two finals at the same time, special ADA cases, and documented personal illness or documented family emergency. In some cases, an alternate final may not be allowed at all.
