

MA 15800 Exam 3 Memo

1. Exam 3 covers Sections 6.1-6.5, 6.7, 7.2. This coverage is Lessons 24 to 34.
2. The exam will consist of 19 **multiple-choice** problems. The exam is **machine graded**, so there will be **no partial credit** available. Word problems will be an important part of the exam.
3. Only a **one-line scientific calculator** is allowed on this exam. No other calculators (two-line, graphing, etc.) are allowed. If you are unsure if your calculator is “legal,” check with your instructor **BEFORE** the day of the exam.
4. Since the exams will be machine graded, the only thing that will be graded is the scantron answer sheet. You may use the question sheet. Double check what you are turning in to make sure you have the correct section number reported and bubbled in. **We cannot grade anything on their question sheets.**
