MA 22300 FINAL EXAM INFORMATION

The final exam is scheduled for **Thursday**, **May 2**, **at 1:00 P.M.** in **Elliott Hall of Music.** Seats will be assigned and you should receive your assigned seat from your instructor by the end of dead week. <u>Only your instructor</u> will have the seating chart for your class.

The final exam is a 175 point, comprehensive, multiple-choice exam. There are 25 questions on the exam and two hours to complete it. The only formulas provided are those listed on the formula sheet on the course web page.

Bring photo i.d. to the final. Without it, you may not be allowed to take the final. Further, you will need to code your ten-digit Purdue i.d. number on the answer sheet. You will also need to code your section number on your answer sheet, to be sure your instructor receives your score on the final. Your instructor will announce this four-digit number in class and at the final.

Practice problems for the final are available on the course web page. However, do not focus solely on these problems to review. Be sure to also look at all the homework problems, the quizzes, your instructor's examples from class and your midterm exams.

Remember to bring a one-line calculator to the final. We cannot share calculators at the final, and cell phones cannot be used as calculators. (Cell phones must be turned off and put away during the final.)

There is no partial credit on the exam. However, you should circle your answer on the exam booklet itself. In the unlikely event that anything happens to your answer sheet, the exam will be used as a backup. (However, note that <u>no</u> regrades will be allowed for miscoded answer sheets.)

At the end of the final, you will turn in <u>both</u> your answer sheet and the exam itself. If all goes well, final exam scores and exam letter grade estimates will be available via the course web page by late afternoon Friday, 5/3. Semester course grades will be available in MyPurdue on Wednesday, 5/8, the week after Final Exams.
