

To determine your grade in Math 13700, you will need to know your exam score(s), your quiz points and your homework points.

Begin with your quiz scores. Determine your % of points for all quizzes by dividing your total quiz points by the total possible quiz points at that time in the semester. Round to the nearest whole percent. This is your number of quiz points for your grade. Note that a point on a quiz is not equivalent to a point towards your semester grade.

For your homework scores determine your % of points for all homework assignments by dividing your total homework points by the total possible homework points at that time in the semester. Take that number and divide by 2. Round to the nearest whole number. This is your number of homework points for your grade. The maximum number of homework points is 50. Note that a point on a homework score is not equivalent to a point towards your semester grade.

Grades in Math 13X00 are assigned as follows:

- 90-100% A > 540 total points out of 600
- 80-89% B > 480 total points out of 600
- 70-79% C > 420 total points out of 600
- 60-69% D > 360 total points out of 600

At the end of the semester, students whose total points out of 600 are within 6 points of an A, B or C, will be considered for the higher grade with a minus if they have missed 5 or fewer class sessions. Do not confuse this with percentage points. They are not the same.

For example, 80% of 600 is 480. If a student's total number of points is very close to 480 and he or she has missed 5 or fewer class sessions, a B- will be assigned.
