# MA 15800 Exam 2 Memo Monday, October 20, 2014 6:30pm in ELLT 

1. Exam 2 covers sections 3.7, 4.1-4.3, 4.5, 5.1-5.4 (Lesson 11-20)
2. The exam will consist of 15 multiple-choice problems. The exam is machine graded, so there will be no partial credit available. Word problems will be an important part of the exam.
3. Only a one-line scientific calculator is allowed on this exam. No other calculators (two-line, graphing, etc.) are allowed. If you are unsure if your calculator is "legal," check with your instructor BEFORE the day of the exam.
4. Since the exams will be machine graded, the only thing that will be graded is the scantron answer sheet. You make keep the exam form. Double check what you are turning in to make sure you have the correct section number and test form number reported and bubbled in. We cannot grade anything on your answer sheets.
