1. Exam 3 covers sections 5.5-5.6, 6.1-6.5, 7.2 (Lessons 21-31).
2. The exam will consist of 15 multiple-choice questions. The exam is machine graded, so there will be no partial credit available.
3. Only a TI-30Xa one-line scientific calculator is allowed on the exam. No other calculators (two-line, graphing, etc.) are allowed. If you are unsure if your calculator is “legal,” check with your instructor **BEFORE** the day of the exam.
4. Since exams will be machine graded, the only thing that will be graded is the scantron answer sheet. You may keep the exam form. Double check what you are turning in to make sure you have the correct section number and test form number reported and bubbled in. **We cannot grade anything on your test form, only the answer sheet.**
