## **Quiz Policies and Procedures**

- 1. Quiz problems will come from my lecture notes (either directly from my notes or a problem very similar to one from my notes) or from a problem on the homework (or very similar to one of these problems). The best way to prepare for a quiz is by completing every example provided in the lecture notes and completing the homework.
- 2. Your name must be clearly written on the inside of the quiz page and on the outside of the vertically folded quiz.
- 3. Only a one-line scientific calculator, such as a TI-30Xa, is allowed for quizzes.
- 4. No sharing of calculators is allowed.
- 5. All cell phones must be put away during quizzes.
- 6. During a quiz, the only items in front of you should be a single sheet of paper, a pencil or pen, and your one-line calculator; everything else should be put away (notebooks, computers, cell phones, etc.).
- 7. If you cannot see what is projected on the screen, sit in a closer seat.
- 8. If I see students talking to each other during a quiz, I will assume they are cheating and each will receive a zero score for the quiz.
- 9. Do not 'look around', during a quiz. You could be suspected on cheating.

- 10. Do not turn in anyone else's quiz, <u>especially for a student who</u> <u>is absent</u>; each student must submit his/her own quiz.
- 11. If you need to ask about a quiz problem, see me during office hours (not right after the quiz).
- 12. Partial credit may be awarded, assuming the work shown supports the answer you derived.
- 13. When you have finished your quiz; turn your quiz over while you pack up your belongings. Remain quiet and bring your quiz to me. If you want to wait for a friend, wait outside of the classroom.
- 14. If you don't know the answer to a quiz problem, don't cheat; take the score you earned and try to do better the next time.

Students who are caught cheating on a quiz may lost ALL their quiz points for the semester, and be reported to the Office of the Dean of Students for further disciplinary action.
