To prepare for Exam 1, students are encouraged to attend office hours.

Exam 1 for Math 13700 will take place on Tuesday, February 7, 2017 at 8:00 pm in GRIS 103.

Please arrive 15 minutes early and bring your Purdue ID or some other form of photo ID.

The exam has three multiple-choice problems and ten open-answer problems for a total of 13. For the multiple-choice questions, there is one for each chapter.

For the open-answer questions, there is one for each lesson.

The exam is worth 100 points.

Students may not ask an instructor to clarify or explain an exam question during the exam.
