MA16010 Online Quiz and Exam Polices

Quiz/Exam Policy: Quizzes and exams will be open book. You are NOT allowed to communicate with any person about the questions in any way. For example, friends, piazza, GroupMe or online tutors are NOT allowed; this is not a comprehensive list. You may use any other resource.

Quiz/Exam extension and exemption:

- Late Work Policy: The late work policy as stated in the syllabus applies to quizzes and exams; that is, the first contact with the instructor must be within 48 hours after the quiz/exam is due in order to be eligible to be considered an extension. Please see more details of the policy in the syllabus.
- **Giving an extension:** If there is an extenuating circumstance, and student follows the late work policy and is able to provide a supporting document, then an extension will be granted. For example, a student is sick with a doctor's note.
- Giving an exemption: If a student is eligible for an extension, but needs a much longer
 extension than the typical time frame, we will work with the student on a case to case
 basis and possibly offer an exemption. If an exemption of a quiz/exam is given, the
 exempted quiz or exam will be replaced by the student's semester average quiz or exam
 grade respectively.
- What circumstances are NOT considered extenuating? Some examples of nonextenuating circumstances to request an extension or reopening of the quizzes/exams are:
 - Missing the deadline (See the updates at the end of the document in red for missing the deadline of an exam)
 - Having a busy week
 - Your device is losing power (make sure you have a charger available before you start)
 - Clicking on the "Done" button by accident before completing the quiz/exam
 - o Forgetting to click on the "submit button" for some questions
 - Not having (reliable) internet: <u>It is crucial that students have RELIABLE internet</u> for this course, particularly for taking quizzes and exams. It is student's responsibility to make sure that they have reliable internet and have backup plans if a connection issue were to arise during a quiz or exam.

Some ideas for reliable internet and a backup plan:

- 1. Reduce the number of programs that you are running on your device.
- 2. If possible, minimize the use of video streaming in your residence during the time of quiz/exam.
- 3. Test out the hotspot from your phone and be ready to use your hotspot if needed.
- 4. Get a cable to connect to the landline of the internet.
- 5. LON-CAPA also works on iPads, tablets and smart phones. Be sure to test them out beforehand.

In an unlikely and/or unexpected event such as a laptop crashing during a quiz/exam, please take a video documentation of what happened and send it to the course coordinator at hdelgado@purdue.edu. The video has to clearly demonstrate the issue. In the case of a computer crashing, simply videotaping a blacked-out screen is not sufficient. The student needs to demonstrate in the video that the power is plugged in, and student attempts to turn on (or use) the computer but it does not work.

We will strictly follow these policies to ensure the fairness to all students in this course.

9/21 Updates: If you miss the deadline of an exam, you MUST contact your instructor within 48 hours after the deadline in order to get an extension of the exam. **There will be a 20 point penalty.** If you do not contact your instructor within the 48 hour time frame, no extension will be given. For example, Exam 1 was due at 9am on Sun, 9/20. If you missed the deadline, but you contact your instructor before 9am on Tues, 9/22, you can get an extension on the exam, with a 20 point penalty. If you do not contact your instructor by 9am on Tues, 9/22, no extension will be given.

The policy stays the same for missing the deadline of a quiz, which is no extension for a missed quiz.
